MEET THE LUNCH BOX CAST





DENNIS SPIELMAN (Editor) is a filmmaker and writer whose most notable work is his travel and interview series, Uncovering Oklahoma. He is the founder of The Show Starts Now Studios, which produces several series such as Art & Victory, Quarter Minutes, Tales Unveiled, and Yes! Science! In addition to his various shows, he is the author of the 16th Phoenix Universe Stories and has made several feature-length documentaries. Dennis currently lives with his wife in Norman, Oklahoma, with their dogs.

LAURA SULLIVAN (Original Artwork) Laura is a freelance artist who believes that "guilt is a wasted emotion." She has been making art in Oklahoma for over 25 years, painting portraits, landscapes, theatre sets, actual human faces; painting big stuff, painting tiny stuff, sculpting, sketching, crocheting, carving, taking photographs, designing escape rooms, making dinosaur heads, and opening young minds (regardless of chronological age). NORMAN HAMMON (Managing Director of Namron Players Theatre) Norman is a seasoned veteran among Oklahoma fundraising consultants, with a passionate commitment to working with small and emerging arts nonprofits. Born and raised in Tulsa, and claiming Norman as his second home, Norman is an Oklahoma native with deep roots. The state figures prominently in his sci-fi novella, "Outworld." Namron Players Theatre's mission of developing original works by Oklahoma playwrights fits perfectly in Norman's wheelhouse—he helped launch Street Players Theatre, one of the first professional theatre companies in Oklahoma, and dedicated to producing original scripts.



SHERYL MARTIN (Artistic/Executive Director of Namron Players Theatre, Playwright & Director) is finally home. All of her mistakes have led her to Namron Players Theatre—no, that's a good thing, really! She considers herself to be ridiculously lucky to get to spend her time talking to people about things they care about and turning their stories into theatre. She wonders what amazing thing she did in her last life to deserve to work with the talented, funny, caring people who came together to help create *Lunch Box* and who are helping Namron Players Theatre to thrive, even in the middle of a freaking plague.
